

A word about Thanksgiving....

On Thanksgiving Eve, I will be sitting with my mom in the pews of the church in which I was born and raised, baptized, confirmed, and married, St. Mark's Episcopal in Jacksonville, FL. Thanksgiving has always been my favorite service of the church year. The church will be decorated beautifully with a huge Cornucopia in front of the altar. Wheat is tied to the processional crosses. Candles are in the windows. The church has an amazing glow to it. I have memories of the long-time rector announcing the service as a "Come as you are service" – come off the road, come out of the kitchen, come from work, come from the cleaning and preparations you are making, etc. As a child, I sang in the children's choir and that was one of the few times we sang with the adult choir and that was always fun. As a youth, I loved acolyting this service. Once I went off to college it was a time, I would see fellow friends who also had gone off to college. Ever since being out of college, I have always planned my travel to Jacksonville so that I would be in town by the time of that Thanksgiving Eve service. It has always been a homecoming of sorts and still is to this day. And the hymns are some of my favorites of the church year. No church so far has been able to duplicate that experience – most other services I have attended have been on Thanksgiving Day. One of my dear friends and mentors, The Rev. Eric Kahl, after being at St. Mark's for a time, tried to duplicate Thanksgiving Eve at the first church in which he was Rector, and he said it just wasn't the same.

From the perspective of our church, Thanksgiving Day is in something of an odd situation. It is only one of two secular holidays that are on our church calendar – the other being The Fourth of July. Everything else on our church calendar is either directly related to the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Christ or related to a Saint. The Prayer Book calls it a major feast, yet its

origins are civic as well as churchly. It is widely observed by the people of this country, but people in other countries generally do not keep Thanksgiving Day, at least not at this time in November.

And the popular observance of Thanksgiving Day among people in the United States in our time is less concerned with attending worship than it is with travel by car or plane to get where we must be, a turkey feast in the home, a gathering of family and friends, football on the field and on the TV screen, and for many of us, a satisfying nap. I cannot tell you how many times I have received weird looks when I share that being in church on Thanksgiving Eve or Thanksgiving Day is a priority for me.

The placement of Thanksgiving Day on November's fourth Thursday does not reflect ancient church tradition but is the relatively recent work of a former vestry member of St. Thomas Parish in Washington, D.C., named Franklin Roosevelt who became President of the United States and established the new date in 1939.

Thanksgiving is one of those holidays that we are often reminded that giving thanks shouldn't be just a once a year or once a season thing. We all know that and hopefully we are thankful throughout the year. This is a holiday in which we are called to pause and be thankful for all that God has given us. But we also as Episcopalians give thanks Sunday after Sunday in the form of the Eucharist.

It is such an odd holiday with all of its complexities, but yet, we in The Episcopal Church have marked it on our church calendar as a feast day and we stop, we reflect, and we give thanks. I

cannot think of a better way to start time with family than to be in church and thank God for all God has given us and continues to give us.

So, before we turn the church calendar to another year and start to prepare for the birth of the Christ child, let us take a moment to reflect and be thankful for all that God has given us.

I am thankful for...

- · Our first year in ministry together
- · Our deep and abiding love for one another
- · Our gift of hospitality
- · Our fighting spirit and resilience
- $\cdot$  Our generosity and service to one another and to our communities around us
- · For all of the saints in this parish past, present, and future
- · For all of my predecessors
- · For how beautiful, unique and wonderful we are
- · For Parish Status
- · But more than anything else, I am thankful for each and every one of you.
