

Acts 16:16-34 (Liberation & Transformation): Paul and Silas' faith in prison led to a moment of unexpected redemption for the jailer and his family. Today, we see similar stories of resilience—people who endure hardship yet find ways to inspire hope and transformation. Whether it's individuals advocating for justice, supporting the oppressed, or seeking personal renewal, this passage reminds us that even in dark times, faith and compassion can lead to liberation.

Psalm 97 (Justice & Joy in God's Reign): This psalm affirms that God's reign is rooted in righteousness and justice, which connects to modern efforts to uphold fairness, combat corruption, and seek equity in society. It also calls for joy in God's sovereignty, reminding us to celebrate goodness in the world even amidst struggles.

Revelation 22:12-14,16-17,20-21 (Invitation & Hope): The passage speaks of Christ's return and the

open invitation to receive the gift of life. In today's world, where uncertainty and crises often leave people searching for meaning, this passage reminds us that hope remains available. The call to "Come, Lord Jesus!" reflects a longing for renewal, justice, and divine presence in our lives.

John 17:20-26 (Unity & Love): Jesus prays for unity among His followers, emphasizing love as a witness to the world. This speaks directly to modern divisions—whether in politics, communities, or families—reminding us of the need for reconciliation, understanding, and shared purpose. It challenges us to embody Christ-like love in our interactions, showing God's presence through our actions.
