I haven't mentioned any of our farm animals in a while. Aiden is working hard to get them all ready for August when he leaves for college. That means updating fencing and making sure all the shelters for the goats and sheep are up to par and ready for colder weather once it comes. Daisy, the little goat that Aiden saved and brought to school for a week—the one all the kids and teachers fell in love with—is free roaming the yard and hanging out with the dogs. At this point, she thinks she is a dog! She'll even nap with the German shepherd on the picnic table.

She still loves a bottle of milk and comes to the back door crying for her ba-ba. Her favorite snacks (besides trying to chew on shoe strings!) are leaves from the trees. Minnie, the other goat Aiden bottle fed from birth, is another spoiled baby who doesn't believe she is a goat. I have to keep her away from my roses because she thinks they are candy! The chickens forage through the yard throughout the day with the rooster crowing at all hours, not just dawn. He is a handsome fellow though. This little stinker has plucked all the tail feathers off the other rooster, showing him who is the real boss of the farm!

My favorite place to sit is on the swing in the back yard. Coach set it up near the pear tree so that I can see out over our land. From my perch, I can see the garden, the pond, the pastures, my roses, and all around our house and next door. It is truly breathtaking when the sun is setting.

The birds have been quite entertaining this season. The mockingbirds fight with each other and fuss at my cat who loves to hang out on the roof and in the pecan tree. The hummingbirds, 2 couples from what I can tell, simply refuse to drink from the feeder together. They will chase each other away even though there are 4 perches and plenty of room for the buffet! The blue marlins are still trying to nest on the front porch, as are the wasps. The blue birds are living peacefully in their little house on the pole above the rainbow lantana. The blue jays have a fine time eating the cat's food and squawking at her no matter where she chooses to stretch out and sun herself. The killdeer having been scooting around the garden this year since that's where they laid their eggs. The robins were angry with the dogs last week because they had two rather large babies out of the nest and on the ground but not flying. The dogs thought that perhaps they were new toys for them, so we put the pups in the pen until the birds could learn to fly. Sometimes it sounds like we are at the aviary at the zoo with all of the different bird sounds!


