

- Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8): The Gospel crosses cultural lines
- Saul's conversion (Acts 9): From persecutor to preacher—God's grace transforms
- Peter's vision & Cornelius (Acts 10): The Gospel opens to Gentiles
- **⊗** Chapters 11–14: Mission Momentum
- Antioch becomes a hub (Acts 11): Disciples are first called "Christians" here
- Paul's first missionary journey (Acts 13–14): Bold preaching, miracles, and opposition


